## CHAPLAIN'S CORNER

Someone recently asked me what the acronym, T.I.M.E. stood for in the T.I.M.E. for Christ Jail Ministry name? I thought that is a good question! A lot of people may not know the definition. The "T" stands for teaching, the "I" stands for intercession, the "M" stands for missions and "E" stands for evangelism. This ministry was established to set inmates free from the bondage Satan has them in through the saving grace of Jesus Christ. Then, to equip them through our prayers and Bible classes to live the life God has prepared for them, in or out of jail or prison. Many people get mixed up about the goals of this ministry. Most will ask, "How many are "saved" or how many have you baptized or what is the recidivism rate on them coming back to the jail? They are looking for numbers. They want to be assured that God's Word and their participation puts inmates back into society all cleaned up and cured of addictions and that they are living the "straight and narrow." I have heard donors say that they will not support this ministry because they are just "fox hole" conversions or they know an inmate that claimed to have received the Lord and then just returned to the old lifestyle. I can't argue with any of that, but that is not the purpose of this ministry. Many times, we have the joy of seeing the results of an inmate coming to the Lord and the outcome is a life turned around, an addict going "clean" and living out a life pleasing to the Lord. I do know that God has a purpose for each and every one of the inmates who come to Him. It may take time for them to live out that purpose and it might even be an incarcerated life to continue in a prison sentence. What Jesus said in Luke 5:31-32 is, "It is not the healthy who need a doctor, but the sick. I have not come to call the righteous, but sinners to repentance." That is the calling of the T.I.M.E. for Christ Jail Ministry! Jesus called his disciples to go into all the world to share the gospel. He called me to head up the team in this 4,000-person prison part of "the world." Oh, it is the darkest of worlds!
